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Regular Courses provide grade level instruction in all essential elements of the State Board approved curriculum and exceed the minimum expectations through various curricular and instructional modifications.

Pre-AP Courses include specific content and activities designed to prepare students for both End of Course exams, and success in college-level Advanced Placement AP courses. AP courses are approved by the College Board and are designed to provide rigorous content for high school students using college level materials and strategies. In addition to all TEKS, a greater depth of the subject matter is taught. There is an emphasis on higher level and critical thinking skills. Provisions for creative and productive thinking are included in these courses. The students are required to complete independent as well as guided research.

College Board Advanced Placement (AP) Courses offer ambitious and capable students an opportunity to take college-level courses in high school. Upon successful completion, the student receives high school credit with honors. If the student takes the AP exam and scores in an acceptable range, college credit may be awarded upon college entrance.

Special Education Courses are offered to assist eligible students in both academic and non-academic areas. Students are placed upon the recommendation of the Admissions Review and Dismissal (ARD) Committee. Graduation requirements are developed by the ARD committee for each individual student.

Career Technology Courses are open to all students without regard to race, color, creed, religious affiliation, sex or handicaps. Students shall be enrolled in two consecutive semester to earn credit, except in designated one semester courses.

Class rank, cumulative from the beginning of the ninth grade, is based on each semester average. It is officially calculated at the end of each academic school year along with the Class rank for seniors.

During the spring semester of 2020, the worldwide COVID-19 pandemic led to the closure of our campuses and student finished their year at home through virtual learning. Per School Board policy, students earned credit based on numerical grades for the spring semester. However, spring semester grades have no impact on the student's cumulative GPA.
