FAFSA Follow-ups

Check your student accounts!

- Students are currently receiving Financial Aid packages from their universities!
- Check the financial aid tab within the student accounts.
- Will need to accept or decline offers based off your need.

Quick info on Loans:

Borrowed money that you have to pay back with interest to the loan servicer. www.studentloans.gov

Subsidized Loans- Reduced interest rates and no interest charged during the time you are at least a part-time student (6 hours min). These loans are for undergraduate students only.

Unsubsidized Loans- Moderate interest will accrue during the time you are a student and during repayment.

Parent Plus Loan- Loans taken out by parents of dependent undergraduate students, based upon credit. Parents can borrow funds up to the cost of attendance minus other aid their student has been awarded

New Student Orientation

If you haven't already done so, now is a good time to schedule your new student orientation. Generally, students will not be allowed to register for their classes until they have completed their new student orientation and submitted proof of vaccinations. Complete these steps early in order to have the **BEST SELECTION OF CLASSES** in the fall.

Meningitis Shots

If you haven't done so in the past year, your student is probably due for his/her booster shot. I would **HIGHLY** recommend getting this shot through your primary care physician. Locations like HEB, CVS and Walgreens are also available but they tend to charge far more money than your copay. Already have the booster? Usually, you need to fax or upload proof of the shot to the university's health clinic.
